This is the story of my little doggy named Bruizer:

Bruizer is a 2 1/2 year old Chweenie and he is the love of my life.. We are inseparable, he even sleeps in my arms at night. I am a huge animal lover and my animals health always comes before my own. Their is nothing I will stop at to make sure they have the best of the best.

Monday afternoon of this week I came home from work and gave Bruizer a treatment of Bravecto (the vet gave me this kind because we have cats and couldn't use advantage any longer)

Tuesday after work I returned home to a sleepy dog, he had a nap and woke up abruptly to him having to vomit. This was the start of it all. I took him outside and he vomited right away, took a few steps staggered and then fell down, he did this about 10-15 times and then vomited again! He was acting drunk to me, being unresponsive when I called his name. When I went to pick him up he was drooling so much that my t-shirt was soaked. I then got on the phone to my vet and was advised to go the emergency right away.

At the emergency clinic Bruizer was vomiting, stretching, crying and falling over. And rubbing his belly on the ground. The vet suspected a blockage in the bowel or pancreatitis. She did

X-rays, nothing showed up except his stomach and bowels were very inflamed. She gave him a shot of morphine and I took him home. I then returned 45 mins later because he was actually getting worse. He could no longer walk very far on his own and was drooling buckets.. And at this point he was crying so much. Repeat X-rays were done, only the swollen intestines showed.. I then told her to do bloodwork. A snap test revealed pancreatitis and she advised me that he needed to be hospitalized and I agreed. He was hooked up to IV for fluid and pain control.

I returned the next morning to then bring him to my regular vet.. Bruizer was still vomiting and crying in pain. My vet didn't think he had pancreatitis because it was a sudden onset of being sick.. More blood work was ordered to check the enzymes of his pancreas. The next day when I returned back to vets to hook him back up to IV I was told that he did NOT have pancreatitis and that the vet had no idea what could be causing his issues.. They had to give him Sulcrate BID and antacids daily to stop the vomiting.

It wasn't until my gf was doing the rebate for Bravecto that we came across all of the warnings and symptoms of this medication.

I called my vet the next day to tell him this is what I thought had happened to Bruizer. He didn't agree or disagree with me.. But started a file with Merck because I have spent over \$2,600 to treat my dog so far and he isn't out of the woods yet.. He has mucus in his stools and blood and is still lethargic..

Before we came across this website (DOES BRAVECTO KILL DOGS, adm.) we also administered this medication to our other 2 small Dogs and the one vomited 3 times during the night after ingesting Bravecto 10 hours prior. He is now very lathargic and has a temperature and loose bowels..

This is all such a worry to me because these dogs are my life.. My fur babies and I will do anything to make them better!

Please read these posts before giving meds to your babies.. Because you could be harming them! I wish I would have come across this website a week ago.. Would have saved a lot of heartbreak!
